Governments around the world have been implementing measures to try to curb the spread of COVID-19. And it has been no different in Cambodia.

The Cambodian Government ordered the closure of all schools and universities on 16 March 2020 and moved to online learning.

More than 18 months later, all educational institutions across the country remain closed and the only way for students to complete their studies is to attend virtual classes.

Awareness Cambodia has always prioritised education, so the children and young adults in our care have all been encouraged to take advantage of every educational opportunity – from primary school through to vocational and tertiary studies. With the National Final Exams for grade 12 taking place in December 2021, Sopheak is studying hard and looking forward to sitting his exams.

From there, Sopheak hopes to carve out a career in the food industry.

Dreaming of becoming a chef, Sopheak wants to cook delicious food.

In preparation, he is getting a lot of hands-on work, helping out in the Graduation House kitchen. Sopheak uses every opportunity to learn from the Graduation House cook.

So when he isn't studying you'll find him in the kitchen preparing food, cleaning vegetables or cooking rice. Outside of the kitchen he also helps with the cleaning and watering the garden.

Sopheak also loves travelling back to Kompong Speu to catch-up and share a meal with his sister, of whom he is very protective.

As Sophoan has severe developmental issues, the happy young woman resides at Sunshine House with her carer.

#### Thearith's sowing the seeds of success

With a passion for agriculture, Thearith was the perfect candidate for the Graduation House Agricultural Scholarship program.



Hailing from the Kampong Chhnang Province – 91km from Phnom Penh – Thearith grew up knowing the value of farming.

The province's main income is from agriculture and its economic goals centre on poverty reduction and food security.

Thearith came from a low socio-economic household and, most importantly, had a desire for education and learning.

These made her an ideal scholarship recipient and she was accepted into the program in October 2015. Having completed high school and receiving good grades, it was a delight for Awareness Cambodia to offer Thearith educational sponsorship through "The Tim Purcell Cambodia Scholarship Fund (TPCSF)".

Therith completed her degree at the Royal University of Agriculture. Ranking number 1 in her classes on more than one occasion, Thearith graduated in 2020 after completing her thesis year.

Her university studies had a strong research focus and after graduating she was quickly snapped up by LN Agri, taking on the role of Assistant Manager at two of the management company's economic land concessions (ELCs) in the remote Kratié Province.

LN Agri said that in remote areas, it is difficult or even impossible to find the caliber of staff you need to run a project. But they lucked out when they met Thearith!

Located in the northeast of Cambodia, Kratié relies heavily on rice paddies, but companies like LN Agri are exploring other agro-industrial crops like red corn, beans, peanuts, soybeans, sesame, tobacco, rubber, cashews, pepper, cassava, bananas and sugarcane.

Given her academic expertise, Thearith's work at the ELCs has been invaluable.

She is the head of cashew research and is also actively involved in rubber research. The main focus of her work is on reducing the use of harmful chemicals to control pests and diseases in cashew and rubber plantations.

Each month her research findings are implemented at the respective ELCs – with great success.

Thearith's work is not only saving the company money but also protecting the crops and increasing productivity.

Her employer said that, due to Thearith's expertise, they have been able to stop using two harmful products and have reduced the use of several others.

Thearith was also instrumental in helping the company to reduce the amount of fertiliser used on their plantations without negatively impacting production (average and above-average crops have been achieved).

LN Agri were thrilled when they recruited Thearith (right): "We couldn't find an individual more suitably qualified, with knowledge of cashew nuts and a passion for research. Cashew nuts are a reasonably new crop in Cambodia and it was difficult to find someone with this expertise."

Thearith's story is a testament to the power of education and the good that Awareness Cambodia is helping the upcoming generation to achieve. Long may her success grow!
