Graduation House welcomes new students

At Awareness Cambodia we believe in the power of education to transform lives. It's why our child development program is focused on affording our students every opportunity to pursue learning – from primary school through to university.

There are so many advantages that a solid education brings, and we want each child in our care to succeed. The progression of our students from Sunshine House to House and Progress and on to Graduation House sets them on the right path.

Once students have completed Year 9, they move from the Sunshine House project to the House of Progress. HoP enables our students to continue their studies (from Grade 10 upwards) at a private school where they have access to the best resources.

The move between projects also means a physical move – as the students leave Sunshine House in Kampong Speu and move into Graduation House in Phnom Penh.

The transition can be challenging initially, but our students are forever resilient and soon adjust. Currently, four students have moved from Sunshine House to Graduation House to continue their education journey – Srey Touc is one of them.



Moving from a rural village to the capital could be daunting, but Srey Touc has adapted well to living in the city and is popular with the other students residing at Graduation House. She has made lots of new friends and fitted right into her new school environment.

Srey Touc takes her schooling seriously and works hard – as evidenced by her excellent results. She was the third top ranked student in her class and got a B in Physics, Morality and Biology and a C in English Language. We received great feedback from her classroom teacher too.

We are looking forward to seeing more achievements from Srey Touc as she completes Grade 10.

We see our role as a supporting one. We could never, and should never, replace community, culture and tradition. We believe that when you build up a child, you're building up the *entire* community.

5. Our care is holistic – we are in it for the long-haul!

We strive to meet all of a child's needs, from education, health and nutrition to counselling and vocational training.

We have been on the ground in Cambodia since 1996 – that's over 26 years impacting lives and creating brighter futures.

The children who first joined us in 2000 have graduated with degrees and are now young professionals. They are marrying and starting families of their own.

We couldn't be more proud of the progress these young people have made!
